The Hamilton Partnership Will Hold a Health Care Forum to Address the Impact of Health Care Reform on Local Businesses

Hamilton, N.J. -- The Hamilton Partnership will hold a Health Care Forum on Wednesday, June 30, to address the impact of recently passed Federal Health Care Reform legislation on small- and medium-sized businesses.

The first segment of this three-part series will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. at the Hamilton Hilton Garden Inn, 800 Route 130, Hamilton, NJ.

Local leaders in health care delivery, health insurance and finance will participate in a panel discussion that addresses the implications of the new law. Members of the panel include Skip Cimino, CEO, Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, Hamilton; Nathan Bosk, FACHE, vice president, Ambulatory Services Division, Capital Health; Jack Blair, president, Nottingham Insurance Company; and Marguerite Mount, managing partner, The Mercadien Group.

The discussion will be moderated by David Kostinas, owner of David G. Kostinas & Associates, a consulting firm serving New Jersey's health care industry.

"Health Care Reform legislation will have immediate and long-range implications in the areas of health care delivery, health insurance and taxes for business owners," says John K.
